

EARN BILL CREDITS FOR CONSERVING ENERGY DURING THE SUMMER.



Voluntarily conserving energy during the summer months lowers your energy bill. Plus, if you lower usage during designated program events, you'll receive annual bill credits through the Power Saver Rewards program.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Earn bill credits by conserving household energy during scheduled Power Saver Rewards program events. A typical customer who participates throughout the summer season can earn \$40 in bill credits.*



Details

- Earn \$2 per each kWh you conserve during an event.
- Events may be scheduled between May 1 and October 31 and occur between 4 p.m. and 9 p.m.
- Enrollment is free and participation is voluntary.
- There are no penalties if you do not reduce usage during an event.

A summer season rewards program.

The PSR program is a residential demand response program that rewards you for voluntarily reducing your energy use during program events. Events are scheduled to help prevent summer power outages when the electrical grid is stressed. When you help to relieve this stress by reducing your household energy use during a program event, you'll earn \$2 in bill credits for each kilowatt-hour (kWh) of electricity you save. A typical customer who lowers energy usage during eight events over an annual season could earn \$40 in bill credits.*

Program events and scheduling.

The PSR program runs each summer between May 1 and October 31. During these months, events may be scheduled between 4 p.m. and 9 p.m. on days when the demand for electricity is high. When an event is scheduled, you will be notified via email one day in advance of a scheduled event or you can sign up for text notifications. For added convenience, you may

also download the free ClimateResponse mobile app by our program partner Olivine, Inc. from the App Store or Google Play to have event notifications and helpful energy saving tips delivered straight to your smartphone.

How to participate in program events.

Participate by lowering your household energy use during event hours. Here are some ways you can conserve energy:

- Turn up your thermostat to 78° or higher, use fans or natural evening air instead of air conditioning, and/or pre-cool your home before event hours.
- Avoid or limit use of large appliances like dishwashers, washing machines, dryers, and electric ovens.
- Turn off lights and electronics, like desktop computers, TVs, and gaming systems, when not in use.
- Disconnect battery-operated electronic devices, like laptops, tablets, and phones.

You may also consider shifting high-energy use activities, such as running the dishwasher, to before 4 p.m. or after 9 p.m. on event days to reduce energy consumption. There are no penalties if you are unable to participate, but the more energy you save during events, the more bill credits you can earn.

Earned bill credits are applied in one lump sum.

When the summer season is complete, we will calculate your earnings based on the amount of kWhs conserved during program events. Earnings will appear as an annual bill credit in the first quarter of the following year. You'll also receive an end-of-season report showing a summary of the energy you saved during the program season, as well as information on your bill credit.

Enrollment is free.

You are invited to enroll in the Power Saver Rewards program at any time by visiting **powersaver.sce.com**.

You'll need the following information to enroll:

1. First and last name of the SCE account holder.
2. SCE service account number, service address, city, and zip code.
3. Email address or mobile phone number to receive event notifications.

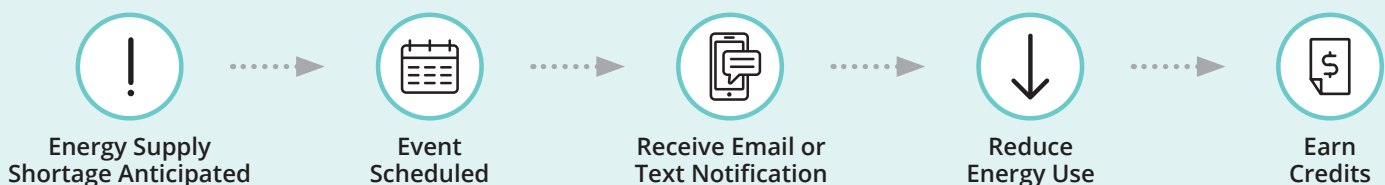
Some customers may be automatically enrolled in PSR. If you were auto-enrolled, you would have received a welcome notification via mail or email.

Earn bill credits all summer long.

Here's how PSR works:



* \$40 bill credit per summer season assumes .5 kW per hour x 5 hours/ event = 2.5 kWh/event x \$2/kWh = \$5/event x 8 events per season (based upon number of Flex Alerts in 2021) = \$40 each summer season.

Incentives are applied in the first quarter of the following year and may vary based on actual load reduction during Power Saver Rewards event(s) and actual number of events.
